Making Indian Carpets

- 1. For many hundreds of years, Indian shepherds and farmers have been making colourful carpets. Here is how they make them.
- 2. First, the wool arrives, and it is cleaned. A big machine spins the wool into yarn.
- 3. Next, the heavy wool is dyed many different colours and hung outside to dry.
- 4. A skilled worker uses a loom to weave the yarn into a colourful carpet. Some people work from 6:15 in the morning to 8:45 at night.
- 5. Merchants sell the large, beautiful carpets to the people in the community.
