#### SINGULAR AND PLURAL

Singular means 'one person or thing'. Plural means 'more than one person or thing' To make a noun plural, we usually add s.







To make nouns ending in s, ch, sh and x plural, we add es.



When a noun ends in y, we have to take off the y and add ies.



If the letter in front of the **y** is a vowel, we just add **s**.




Remember! The vowels are: a, e, i, o and u


